Who is Eligible

You are eligible for disability services if you:

- Have a physical, mental or sensory impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities;
- Are perceived to have such an impairment;
- Have a record of such impairment or have an abnormal condition that is medically cognizable or diagnosable.



What services are available?

Services may include but are not limited to:

- Accessible facilities
- Alternate educational media
- Alternate testing
- Disability parking
- Manual and oral interpreters
- Notetaking
- Priority registration
- Reading services
- Scribes
- Specialized equipment
- Taping services

Is special guidance available?

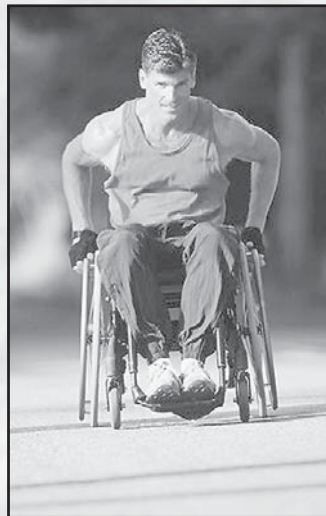
Yes! Counselors are available to help you with:

- Admissions
- Academic and career planning
- Community resources
- Financial aid

Counselors are also available to help orient you to campus and refer you to other programs and services, including community resources.

What are my responsibilities if I believe I qualify for services?

- Identify yourself as a student with a qualified disability
- Provide documentation regarding your disability
- Request reasonable accommodations at SVC
- Request services early
- Meet and maintain academic standards



What are my rights?

You have a right to services and reasonable accommodations which allow you to compete on an equal basis with non-disabled students as long as you meet the basic requirements to perform activities of the program or occupation.

Information regarding your disability is confidential and will not be released to anyone without your written permission.

How are disputes settled?

If you have a complaint or concern about campus accommodations, please contact Disability Support Services at your respective campus. Your concern will be addressed promptly and effi-

ciently. There is an informal and formal grievance procedure available on campus to assist in dispute resolution.

No qualified individual with a disability shall, by reason of such disability, be excluded from the participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of any public entity, or be subject to discrimination by any such entity. Americans with Disabilities Act, 1990 (Section 202)

No otherwise qualified, handicapped individual in the United States shall solely by reasons of his/her handicap, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. Rehabilitation Act of Congress, 1973; Title V (Section 504)
