

MLA Documentation: Authors' names

IN TEXT: MLA documentation is an author/page system; use author or authors' last names and the page number.

- In parenthetical in-text citations are formatted based on how many authors the source has.
- When you use a **narrative citation (attribution)**, it also depends on whether it is the **first** time the source has been used in the paper or a **subsequent** use (all uses after the first).

In parenthetical citation (no narrative citation/attribution):

One author	Two authors	Three or more authors
(Chen 17)	(Garcia and Martin 17)	(Stanislau et al. 17)

When using a narrative citation (attribution): Note: Use a present tense verb.

First use: full name(s) & page #		Subsequent use: last name(s) only	
author	*Darwin Chen, in "Rogerian Reconsidered," concludes (206)	Chan concludes (206)	
1 au	Darwin Chen concludes (206)	- Chen concludes (206)	
authors	Ruben Garcia and Taylor Martin, in their evaluation, find (1145)	Garcia and Martin find	
2 aut	Ruben Garcia and Taylor Martin find (1145)	(1145)	
authors	**Marcia Stanislau et al., in "Gazing Male in Birdcage," argue (72)	Stanislau et al. argue	
3+ au	Marcia Stanislau et al. argue (72)	(72)	

^{*} Including the title of the source is optional

1 author	Chen, Darwin. "Title of Article."
2 authors	Garcia, Ruben, and Taylor Martin. "Title of Article."
3+ authors	Stanislau, Marcia, et al. "Title of Article."



^{**} et al. = abbreviation of the Latin "et alia," which means "and others"
