

## MLA Documentation: Title formats in Works Cited entries

- In MLA, ALL TITLES are written in title case.
  - o <u>Title case</u> means to capitalize something the way most of us learn to write titles: capitalize all major words
- What kind of source is indicated by **TYPE STYLE**: titles are either in ITALICS or in **QUOTATION MARKS**.

One way to think of MLA titles is that whole things made up of parts are in italics; parts of a whole are in quotation marks.

Be sure to check a handbook for whether / when the title in a Works Cited entry needs to be followed by a period or a comma, etc. (Note: Periods and commas go "inside" quotation marks in American English.)

Title of	Type style	Example
a <b>book</b>	ITALICIZED	Contemporary Art: World Currents
a journal, magazine, or newspaper	ITALICIZED	Cinema Journal
an entire website	ITALICIZED	Black Film Center/Archive
a database	ITALICIZED	Academic Search Complete
an article in a journal, magazine, or newspaper	"quotation marks"	"Theodore Roethke's 'North American Sequence': Religious Awakening in the West"
a page from a website	"quotation marks"	"Reading the Region: Northwest Schools of Literature"
