- If you have taken only one semester of a math class, you cannot use that course for placement.
- There is no averaging of grades. A student with an A and C in each semester of a year-long course would not be eligible for placement in a course that requires “at least B (each semester).” A student with an A and a B in each semester of a year-long course would look at “at least B (each semester)” placement.
- If you want to place higher than transcript placement allows, review other placement options including taking a placement test.
- If there is a large discrepancy between placement scores and transcript placement, consider that classes in high school usually move at a slower pace than college classes. Will you be comfortable with a faster paced math class?
- Once you begin your SVC math course, please see your math instructor as soon as possible within the first few days if you feel you were not placed correctly.
