The College will collaborate with its communities through the exchange of knowledge and resources.

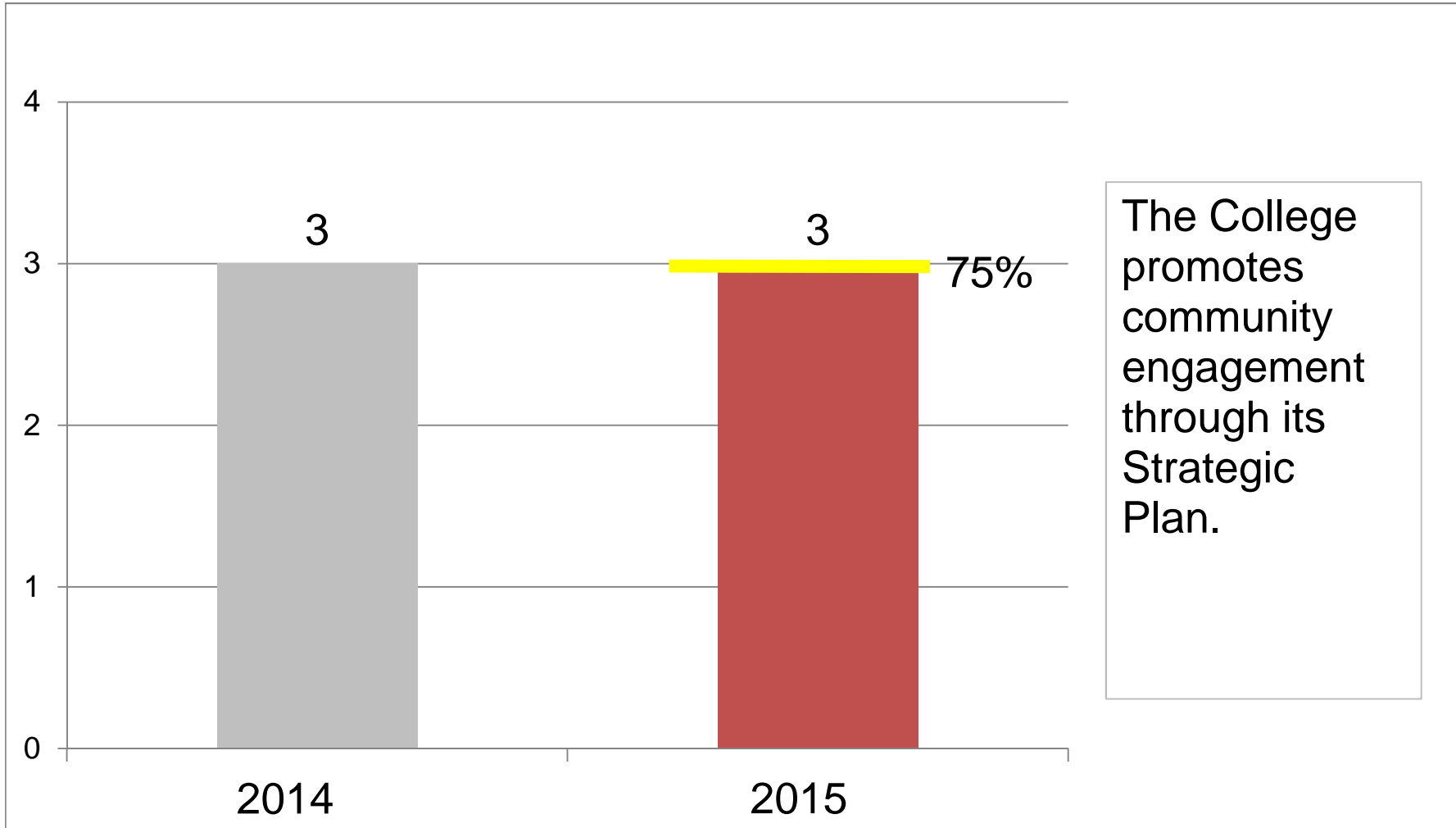
Indicator:

Gelmon/Carnegie scores will average 75% of the maximum score.

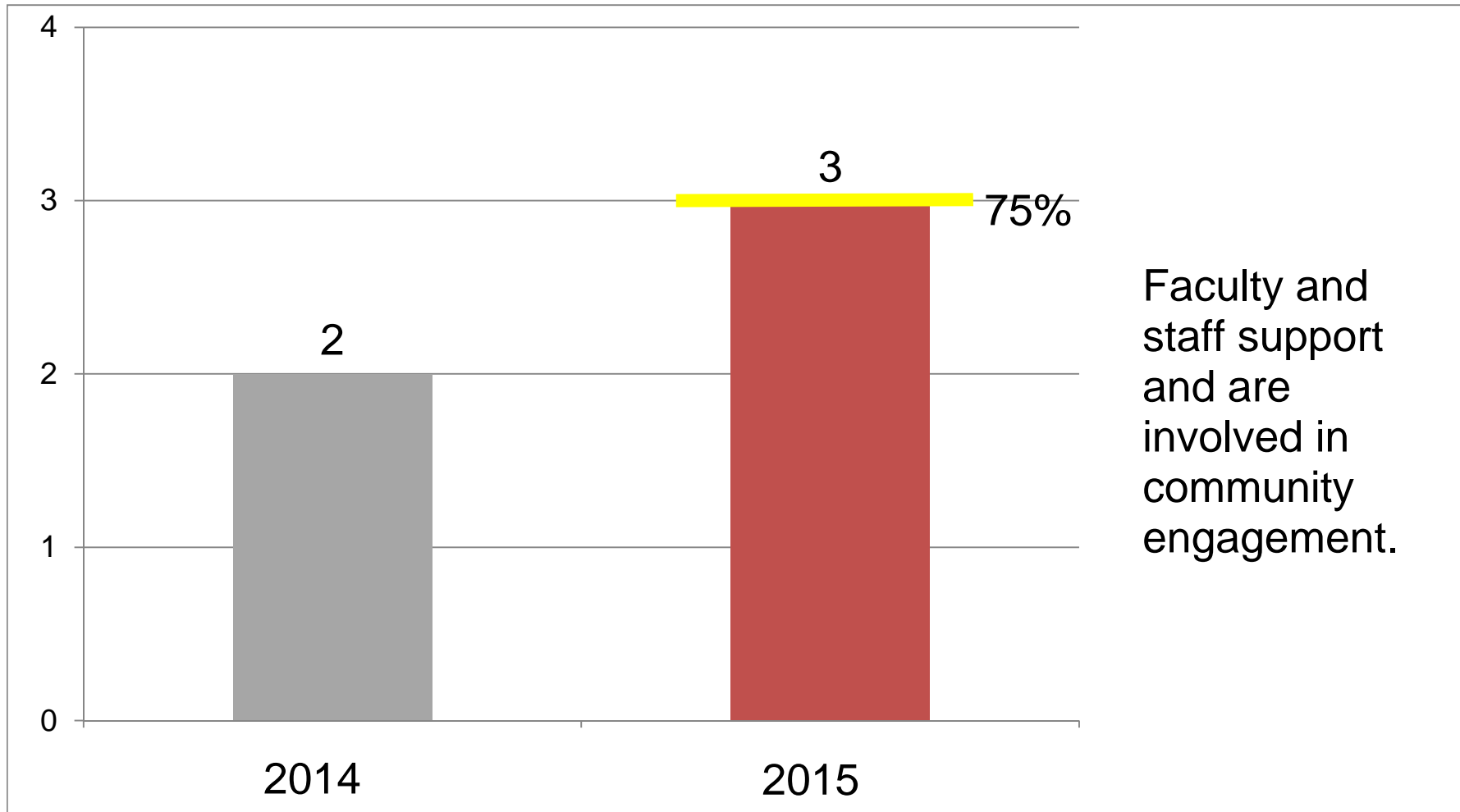
Gelmon/Carnegie Community Engagement Assessment



SVC employees rated the College 3 out of 4 for promoting community engagement through its Strategic Plan -- meeting the 75% threshold.



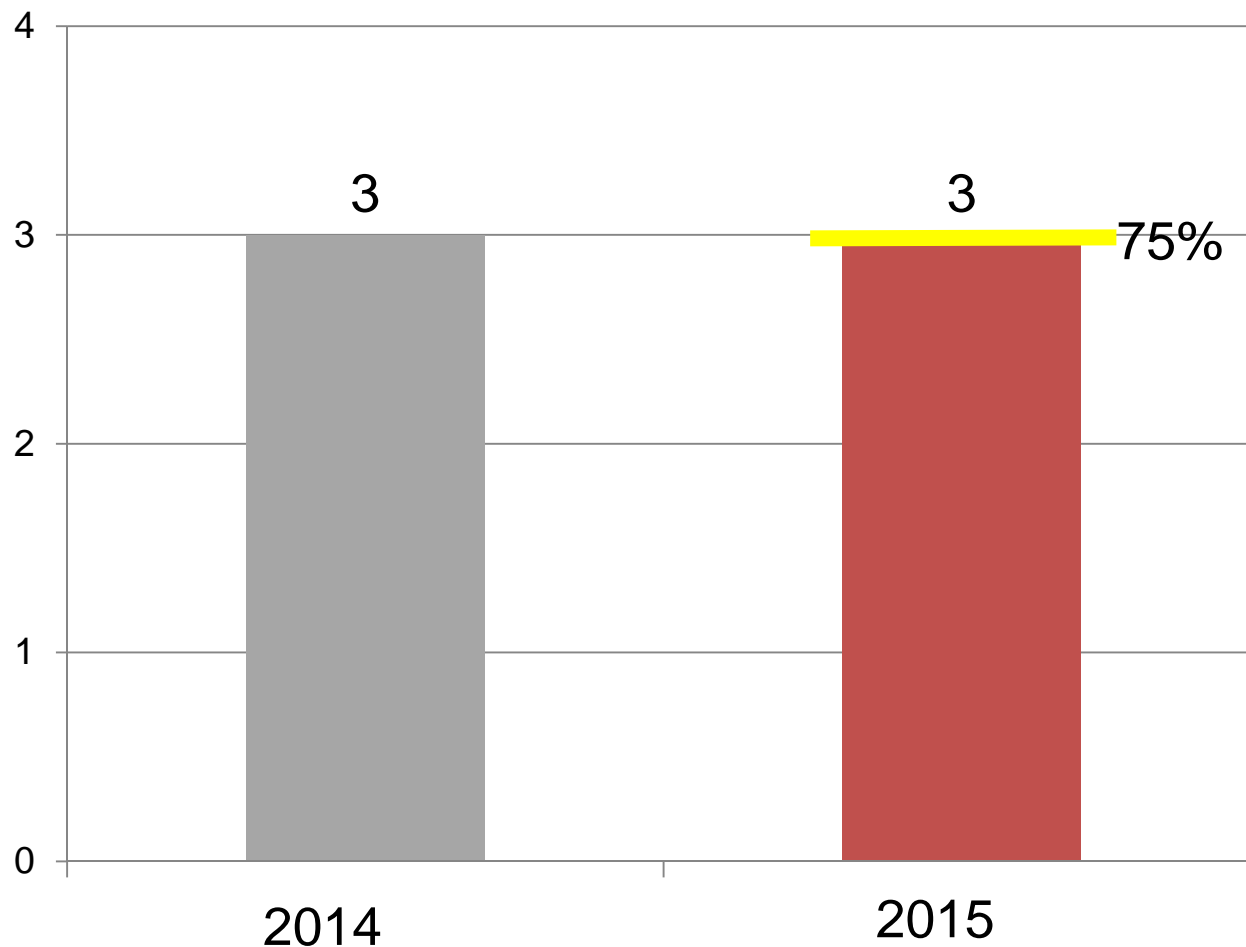
Gelmon/Carnegie Community Engagement Assessment

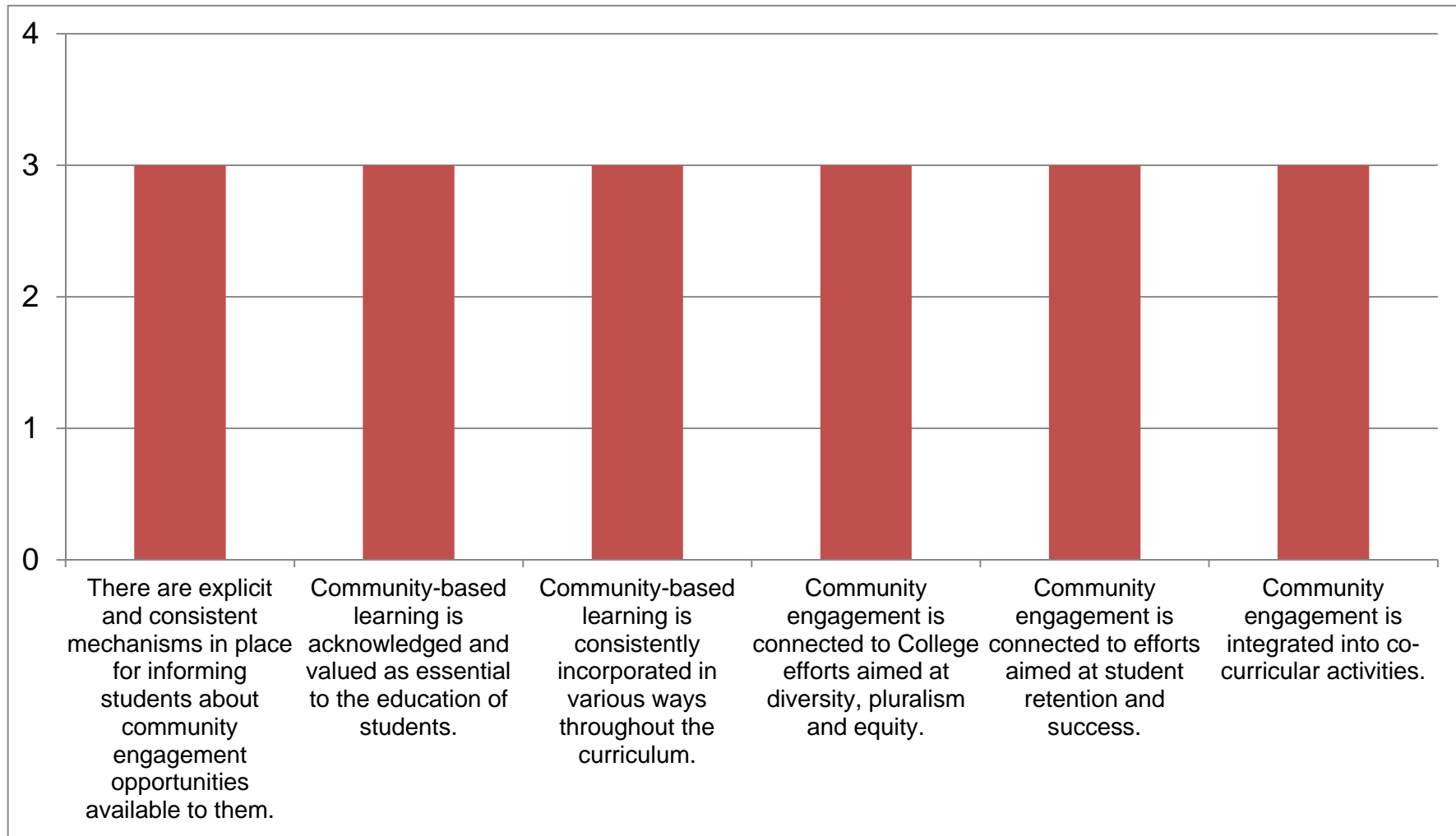


The College provides student support for, and involvement in community engagement.
