Historically, as the unemployment rate in Skagit County dips, so does SVC enrollment. COVID has affected this historical trend.

SVC enrolled 92% of the 2019-20 state-funded allocation target.





Participation Rate



Participation Rate: The number of persons age 18-44 years enrolled as a percent of the relevant population.

SVC's participation rate is consistently 1 percentage point higher than the CTC system.

The College minimizes barriers and maximizes opportunities for diverse student populations


Indicators

Threshold

Parity between district population and enrollment for student subpopulations.

Latinx Students Compared to District




SVC enrolled 7 percentage points more Latinx students than the community's percentage of Latinx residents.

4 Year Trend of Latinx Enrollments




SVC continues a high enrollment of Latinx students.

4-Year Trend of Degree-Seeking Latinx Enrollments




SVC continues to increase Latinx enrollments.


CCB Students Compared to Adults with No HS Diploma/GED in District




SVC enrolled 1% higher CCB students compared to community's percentage of adults ages 18-44 with no high school diploma or GED.



4-Year Trend of CCB Enrollments Compared to District




ELA Students Compared to District Adults With Limited English Proficiency

- With higher unemployment COVID-19 has directly affected the traditional higher enrollment
- SVC continues to serve a higher percentage of Latinxs than the district population
