<u>NOTE</u>!: When a Running Start student takes a class at SVC to meet an OHHS graduation requirement, quite often the student will earn <u>more</u> credit than needed. The extra credit amount earned is usually applied to elective credit. Example: Social Science 100 = .50 credit for Modern Global Economics <u>and</u> .50 elective credit.

<u>Advisory</u>: Students enrolled in Running Start classes are required to either attend a High School Advisory class or complete the requirements with a OHHS Running Start Advisory teacher.
