SVC Celebrates Lewis Hall Mural

Honoring the contributions and resilience of Black People of the African Diaspora, and the legacy of Dr. Ernest Tutt

Skagit Valley College celebrates the addition of a new mural called, "Honoring the contributions and resilience of Black People of the African Diaspora, and the legacy of Dr. Ernest Tutt." The mural is located on SVC's Mount Vernon Campus, on the second floor of Lewis Hall. SVC Communication Studies instructor, Angela Logan, worked with Dr. Tutt's widow, Beverly Havens-Tutt, artist Myron Curry, SVC's Art Committee, Black Student Union, Office of Equity and Inclusion, and the Office of the President to bring this installation to life.

Dr. Ernest Tutt was a cherished colleague and friend throughout his time at SVC as a tenured Communication Studies Professor. He passed away in 2018. He is remembered for his kindness and devotion to the college's Guiding Principles of Integrity, Respect, Open and Honest Communication, Collaboration, and Compassion.

When Angela was conceptualizing the mural, she was looking for a way to honor ancestors from the African Diaspora, celebrate Dr. Tutt's legacy, and to inspire the next generation of students to evolve in their sense of self, community, and consciousness.



"Dr. Tutt was a patron of education, the arts, and grace. He believed in the practice of teaching as the way to a better tomorrow," said Angela. "We need to build a bridge to the future because our students depend on it."

The mural was painted by Seattle-based artist Myron Curry. Myron is known for his vibrant mural work, portraits, and design-work that is on display throughout Washington state. Much of his work focuses on Black artists, writers, and musicians.

According to Angela, "Myron's portraits and mural work paint Black people as if we are supernatural, lifting us out of a struggle that continues to oppress us lifts us into the light."

In November, the mural was welcomed with an artist reception, performance, and remembrance of Dr. Tutt's indelible legacy at SVC. The **Dr. Ernest Tutt Memorial Scholarship** supports students in the humanities, including communication studies, ethnic studies, and sociology.







Can you tell us a little about your history?

I am Chef Courtney Bourasaw, of The Skagit Table, voted Skagit's Best Caterer in 2023. I attended SVC from 2013-2015. After graduating, I was a personal chef and caterer for seven years before opening The Skagit Table.

How did you dream up The Skagit Table?

The Skagit Table is so many dreams rolled into one. I always wanted my own kitchen, the take-home meals came after my step-daughter's terminal cancer diagnosis. I want healthy food to be accessible to all, our youth to have exposure to better foods, and to support local farmers while doing it.

What would you share with others just starting at SVC?

You're at a huge turning point in your life, pause and take these moments in, it's exciting. Access to education is a privilege, don't take it for granted.

How did you choose to attend SVC and SVC's Culinary Program?

I was living in LA when I got pregnant. With no stability in my life, and less than a year of sobriety under my belt, my grandma, who lived on Camano, offered to care for my son while I attended college. Cooking had become an interest of mine and thank goodness, it stuck.

What was the impact of attending SVC?

I could sing the praises of my teachers all day. I came from a rough background and was barely finding myself, my teachers were so gracious. They encouraged me, supported me, and were even protective of my sobriety. SVC is where I found my passion for local sourced food, sustainability, and community. That goes beyond teaching.

Is there anyone at SVC that was particularly supportive?

Yes, and they still are. Gil Rodriquez, Suzanne Butler, Dani Cook, and Lyn Highet are all amazing cheerleaders. I received a single mother scholarship that was so beneficial in supporting me in my education.

You have been incredibly successful as a chef, and worked very hard to get where you are today. Where does that motivation come from?

My grandma gave up so much so I could have a fresh start in life, she helped care for my oldest and create a path for my success. She passed away last year; I know what I am doing makes her proud every day. My kids, who I love and adore, think "mom's kitchen" is the coolest place ever. My husband who motivates, listens, and comforts me on the hard days; he is my biggest cheerleader. And the Lord, who put me in this spot to serve my community and bless others. He has put this place on my heart and provided a way to make it happen. I am motivated by His grace and love for me.


What are your goals and dreams looking ahead?

A Champion of Champions

Since 2011, Nancy Chapman has been a steadfast supporter of SVC's Champions of Diversity (COD) Scholarship. The Champions of Diversity Scholarship recognizes young multicultural leaders in Skagit, Island, and San Juan counties and annually awards 10 first-year and 10 second-year scholarships.

When Nancy passed away in February 2023, she honored the SVC Foundation with a bequest in support of COD, ensuring the scholarship will continue to support students for generations. Nancy's life story and her commitment to supporting equity and diversity in our community is truly inspiring.

Throughout her life, Nancy was committed to the community wherever she lived. She cared for foster babies, became a companion to the elderly, volunteered as a reading assistant at schools, supported homeless or undocumented neighbors, and worked to protect wilderness areas.

"She was pragmatic with her giving and committed to breaking the cycle of poverty," said Karen Williams, Nancy's

daughter, who described her mother as practical. "She knew that students' success stories are not always linear--that there are setbacks. She was committed to supporting those who faced obstacles to their success."

Nancy's generosity has helped SVC's Office of Student Equity and Inclusion to create wrap-around services for COD students including a dedicated advisor and financial aid contact.

First-vear COD students are involved in the Cardinal Mentoring Program where they receive help with goal setting, social support, and referrals to campus services. On a quarterly basis, all COD students meet with campus leadership to learn the elements of leadership.

The scholarship provides support for historically underserved students and is a lifeline for students who are ineligible for federal financial aid. Nancy's bequest will play a vital role in ongoing support for COD students.

In 2023, the Champions of Diversity (COD) Scholarship celebrated 24 years of scholarship for SVC students. Throughout those years, the scholarship has impacted hundreds of students from our region.

One of those students was Livy Gates. Livy was adopted out of Seattle at the age of two with her older sister. They grew up in Anacortes and Livy is a graduate of Anacortes High School. She was nominated for the COD Scholarship by a teacher at Anacortes High School, who described Livy as "optimistic, compassionate, generous, and genuine."

This year, Livy received both the COD Second-Year Scholarship and the **Soroptimist International of Anacortes** Marge Thomas Scholarship. While in high school she developed a passion for education and currently volunteers in a kindergarten classroom. Livy is well on her way to her Associate's in Early Childhood Education with plans to transfer to Western Washington University.





Bachelor of Applied Science in Advanced Manufacturing and Design

Skagit Valley College (SVC) will soon offer six bachelor's degree programs. Starting fall 2024, SVC's Manufacturing Technology program (MANF) will offer a Bachelor of Applied Science in **Advanced Manufacturing and Design** (BAS-AMD). The BAS-AMD is designed to meet the growing employment demands for graduates with advanced skills in manufacturing processes and knowledge of management, finance, and leadership skills.

Currently, MANF provides an educational pathway that includes multiple program on-ramps where students can earn skillbased certificates and an Associate of Arts and Science degree in Advanced Manufacturing and Design (AAS-AMD). After completing their associate's, these students can continue on and complete the BAS-AMD degree.

The BAS-AMD is a two-year, 90-credit degree for those who hold an associate's degree in fields such as manufacturing, including various industrial technology degrees, or for those students with 90+ college credits and relevant work experience. The program is designed to support working students and comprises both in-person and online coursework.


SVC has invested more than \$1 million in a MANF lab renovation, which includes a new 5-axis CNC machine that was made possible thanks to a \$250,000 donation from an anonymous donor to the SVC Foundation. Facilities include a MakerSpace that includes a new Wazer Waterjet (made possible thanks to WECU), 3D printers, a laser cutter, electronics, and machining equipment.

"Graduates of the program will be wellequipped to pursue a career in a wide range of local and regional industries," said Dave Knapp, SVC Associate Dean of Instruction Workforce Education Pathways. "They will learn skills to collaborate on the design, development, and implementation of manufacturing systems that are efficient, cost-effective, and produce highquality products."



SVC Foundation Receives WECU Education First Grant

The SVC Foundation was recently awarded a **WECU Education First Grant** to purchase vital equipment for **SVC's Manufacturing Technology program.** The Grant will be used to purchase a 4 Axis CNC ('computer numerical control') Machine upgrade and a WAZER Waterjet to enhance SVC's Manufacturing Technology Program.

The Manufacturing Technology program provides students with skills for a variety of manufacturing jobs through hands-on training in a newly renovated, working production lab. The program provides multiple pathways, including an Associate of Arts and Science degree in Advanced Manufacturing and Design (AAS-AMD). Next year, SVC will begin offering a four-year Bachelor of Applied Science in Advanced Manufacturing and Design (BAS-AMD).


SVC's Manufacturing Technology Program has a long-standing reputation for delivering industry-standard, exceptional training to students. Graduates from the program are in high demand in a variety of industries including aviation, composites, marine technology, engineering, and construction.

"Up-to-date equipment is the lifeblood of our professional-technical programs, this kind of equipment is the costliest element of workforce education and the most challenging to fund," said Darren Greeno, Interim Vice President of Academic Affairs. "WECU's Education First Grant will have a significant impact on our students, helping them earn a living wage to support themselves, their families, and meet the demands of our community," said Darren.

Student Scholarships

\$803,582 awarded to 353 students

Ask any scholarship recipient how receiving a scholarship helped them, and you will find it is always more than financial. This couldn't be more true for **Jonathan Garcia-Pantoja**.

"With this award, I have the sense that there are people in our community that are supporting me in my educational journey and cheering me on," said Jonathan.

SVC Foundation scholarships open doors for students to dream, Jonathan is the first member of his family to attend college and he knew the financial burden was going to be heavy.

"An SVC scholarship is a big opportunity and helps lighten the heavy cost of college from my family," said Jonathan.

Jonathan graduated from Burlington-Edison High School in 2022. After not getting into the college of his dreams, Jonathan chose to attend SVC with plans to transfer to the University of Washington where he plans to study business and accounting.

This year, Jonathan received the **George W. Wallace Scholarship**. The George

students studying in the field of Business
Management with the intent of transferring
to a four-year college/university to pursue a
career in accounting.

Athletics Scholarships

\$105,816 awarded to 65 student-athletes

Briley Bock – For many SVC Students, their ability to complete a college degree would not be possible without the support of scholarships. Briley Bock is one of those students. Briley is from White Swan, WA and is a descendent of the Yakama Nation and Shoshone Bannock Tribes.

Briley was an accomplished high school athlete, with plans to attend a four-year university on an athletic scholarship when a torn ACL and meniscus threatened to derail her college plans.

When SVC Basketball Coach Deb Castle reached out with a scholarship and an opportunity to rehabilitate her knee, Briley jumped at the chance to be a Cardinal. She is now a second-year, 3.7 GPA, multisport student-athlete, with plans to transfer to a four-year school next year for a degree in Agri-Business. As a daughter and granddaughter of cattle ranchers, Briley is excited to continue her family legacy. She knows how hard it is for her to be away from her family's business, especially during the calving season and harsh winters of Eastern Washington.

Receiving a scholarship for the 2023-24 school year was a huge emotional relief for Briley.

"In addition to providing added financial stability for myself and my family, receiving these scholarships was a huge honor," said Briley. "The scholarships felt like a reward for the work I put in maintaining a full class load

STUDENT EMERGENCY FUND

\$62,580 awarded to 107 students

Managing the cost of higher-education is a high-wire act for most SVC students.

Eric Gallardoflores was a 4.0 student working on his transfer degree when the increasing cost in rent, groceries, and gas overwhelmed his ability to continue his education. He limited his driving to the bare minimum, held off on buying textbooks for classes, using the textbooks available to students in the library, and borrowed money from family and friends to try and make ends meet.

Thankfully, an SVC professor told Eric about the SVC Student Emergency
Assistance Fund. He was relieved to experience some assistance so he could stay on track.

"I have been able to make ends meet because of the fund," said Eric. "I was going to shy away from support but realized it would not be to my benefit to do so. I encourage anyone needing assistance to apply if it means continuing your education."

\$76,487 awarded to 132 students

Every parent knows how difficult it is to find safe and reliable childcare, let alone afford the skyrocketing costs. Like so many SVC students, Kimberly Thornton wouldn't be able to finish her degree without full-time childcare for her son.

Kimberly Thornton was in her last (and most demanding) quarters of SVC's nursing program when she realized she would need full-time childcare to manage the demands of her program. Kimberly and her husband don't have family nearby, so they rely on one another and childcare to balance the demands of work, school, and life.

Thanks to SVC's Childcare Assistance Fund, Kimberly was able to enroll her son in full-time pre-k so she could complete her degree.

"Any financial assistance for myself and my family helps get me through school," said Kimberly. "Childcare is very expensive, and without help, it is nearly impossible to finish my degree."

Thanks to donor support, Kimberly completed her nursing degree in 2023!

Opportunity for Excellence

Passion and personal connection drive generosity. That is the theme of the 35year relationship between **Dr. Brinton** Sprague and SVC's Marine Technology program.

In 1988, Dr. Sprague became Dean of Whidbey Island Campus and soon selected Mike Swietzer as the lead faculty member of the Marine Technology program. Together, they built the program with strong student enrollment and excellent relationships with the local marine industry. The growth has been sustained under the guidance of current instructor, Mike Beemer.

Initially, the fledgling Marine Technology program was based at a cramped and isolated building outside Oak Harbor. In Marine Technology Center in Anacortes, which boasts instructional classrooms and

2010, the program moved into the beautiful mechanical and lab space.


This summer, Dr. Sprague donated the Lady M, a 25' Ranger Tug powerboat, valued at \$62,500, to the program for student hands-on training. Mike welcomed the new boat.

"Students will spend the next few months learning about and refurbishing the boat," said Mike. "When done, the boat will be auctioned to the public to provide vital funding for program improvements."

"This pleases me so much," Dr. Sprague commented. "I have always had a soft spot for the Marine Tech program. I know they will make the most of the contribution."

Marine Technology graduates are continuing on to SVC's Bachelor of Applied Science in Management, (Management, BAS).

The Management, BAS is for students interested in management with a professional-technical associate degree in programs such as Marine Technology.
